2010 Jamann Sailing Adventures

In June we headed down to pick up Jamann in the BVI and sailed her over to the US Virgin Islands and spent most of our two weeks there. Admittedly that was not very far as the distance between Tortola, BVI and St. John, USVI is less than a mile across the passage known as The Narrows. But the mission for the trip, with just the two of us aboard, was to check out the towns, harbors and anchorages on St. Thomas and St. John. When we move aboard Jamann permanently we'll

establish a residency in the USVI via a post office box. We're not expecting to get a lot of snail mail as most of our communications will be via email and the internet. We had the opportunity to meet a number of people and gathered good information on boat yards, marinas and marine stores while



checking out some very nice anchorages. One of the highlights of the trip was our stay in Leinster Bay off St. John. Here we enjoyed some great snorkeling off Waterlemon Cay, a nice long hike along the beach and shore line surrounding the bay and a visit to the 18th century ruins of the Annaberg Sugar Mill Plantation. So we are now ready to host a sailing adventure for you in the US Virgin Islands. Getting there from the US is easy (non-stop flights from Philadelphia to St. Thomas),

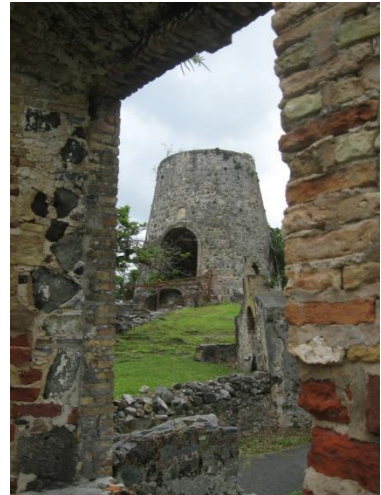

relatively inexpensive, you don't need a passport and you don't have to deal with the hassles of customs and immigrations. The sailing is good, the food and beverages are great, there are many nice places to snorkel, swim and/or dive and there are a number of very interesting things to do ashore. And watching the full moon rising from a quiet mooring in Fat Hog's Bay was a great way to end the adventure.

They will be joining us for the Thanksgiving holiday week which is a great time for a sailing adventure in the Caribbean. This time of year the weather is great, the water is still quite warm and clear and it's still not crowded. Besides, for Thanksgiving week you'll only need to use 3 days of vacation from work. Chef HiHo has a couple of great recipes for a Thanksgiving feast Caribbean style. So you will not miss out on the great holiday food.
