We love to sail, in case that wasn't obvious! Which also means we hate to run the engine for any reason, especially for things like charging batteries and running appliances. So Jamann has gone green! Maybe not 100% green but we've taken a huge step in that direction. After all we still have that engine and need it to move about in tight quarters. But, we've added solar panels and a wind generator as our primary sources of energy for charging batteries and powering all of our lights, refrigeration system, radios, navigation equipment, laptops, cellphones, etc.. This combination generates a lot of power with our abundance of both sunshine and wind year round. Now we can run the



refrigeration system 7/24 to make sure Kathy's beers stay cold (have to keep the Capt'n happy). And

we've also replaced almost all of our lights with LED bulb replacements which significantly cuts down our power usage. So with solar and wind power generation we've eliminated the need and noise of running the engine for up to 3 hours a day and cut our diesel fuel consumption by more than 85%. This of course makes the crew and our guests (and our accountant) very happy.

Helping Mariners Through the Maze

That's the motto of the Captain School USVI here in Red Hook, St. Thomas. With both of us holding Master 50 GT Captain Licenses we are now working part time with the Captain School teaching their US Coast Guard approved course for preparing mariners to successfully pass the USCG exams to become licensed Operator Uninspected Passenger Vessel (OUPV) captains. This is a pretty intense fast paced 8 day course covering 4 general categories (Rules of the Road, Navigation General, Deck General and Chart Plotting) and culminating with an exam in each category. The mariner has to pass all 4 exams to be able to submit an application for their captain's credentials. We are having a lot of fun working with fellow mariners and helping them to achieve their goal of becoming captains. Later this year we may get the opportunity to sail down to St. Croix to teach this course there. That will be a great opportunity for us to spend some more time on that island having visited there twice before. While there we'll be checking out St. Croix as a possible sailing area for our charter guests.

We still have charter slots available for Jan. 10-17, May 23-30 and July 11-18. If these available dates might work for you to come down and have some fun sailing in the sun you should get in touch with us immediately before someone else get these slots. In particular the July dates would be ideal for teachers or couples with kids in school who can't get away until school is out. As mentioned in previous newsletters and on our website we generally do not do any charters between July 15th and October 15th due to the challenging and unpredictable weather (i.e. hurricane season). But depending on what other activities we might commit to we might be able to accommodate a charter request during the period of Oct. 15th to Dec. 15th. Due to the holiday season we usually do not do charters between Dec. 15th and Jan. 7th so that our crew has time off to celebrate with everyone else.

With the 2015 season well booked we do have some guests already looking at dates for the 2016 season. So now would be a great time to start planning for a 2016 charter by contacting us and letting us know that is what you are thinking about. Then we can start looking at potential dates and destinations to see what will work best for you.
